THE CURRICULUM

We believe a prep school education enables each child to be treated as an individual, to feel valued and, above all, to reach their full potential. Every child is unique and it is at this young age that excellent foundations can be laid and a sense of aspiration created. Offering more than just academic success we place equal value on what happens outside the core subjects – the importance of sport, music, drama, art, design and a varied programme of activities which adds an extra dimension to a child's education.

We have a maximum of 16 children per class keeping the ratio of staff to pupils high. Their education is further enhanced by the use of specialist teachers. This means that each child has a greater chance of being understood and provided with personalised guidance.

Additional support as well as further individual challenge can be given when needed, building the confidence which is so important for a child. Enthusiastic and passionate teaching staff inspire and nurture a love of learning and instill inquisitive learning in pupils, allowing them to become critical thinkers.

Pupils are encouraged to strive for excellence by developing their academic, musical, sporting, artistic and personal potential both at school and within the community.









THE ARTS

We consider the creative arts to be life enriching and encourage all pupils to discover their creative talents.

Our Practical Room provides a wonderful space and is well equipped for all aspects of art, design and design technology.

Drama, music and dance are taught to all classes from Nursery by specialist teachers.

Children are encouraged to compose their own music, as well as having the opportunity to learn an instrument and sing in the choir. Performance assemblies and concerts are a regular feature of school life. The highlight of the year is our Summer Show. Every child in the school has a part in our end of year performance and every member of staff is involved in its production. It is a truly collaborative, whole community effort.

We enrich our own artistic efforts by making full use of the facilities that London has to offer, with visits to art galleries, concerts and theatres.







PHYSICAL EDUCATION

We are very keen on sport and PE at Grange Park Prep. The children have outstanding opportunities to develop their full potential in PE and Sport, whilst improving their own physical fitness.

PE and games are taught by specialist staff. The children have weekly PE, gymnastics and games lessons.


Our main games are netball, football, hockey and rugby in the winter and tennis, cricket, athletics and rounders in the summer. We also enjoy cross-country running, multi-skill festivals and other sporting events.

The younger children are taught within the school grounds whilst the older ones make use of off site facilities for games lessons. Year 3 & 4 swim at a local pool.

We enjoy an extensive list of fixtures against other schools throughout the year as well as local festivals and friendly competitions.







EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

A wide range of activities take place in clubs at lunchtime and after school. They may include sports, music, art, cooking, science, chess, English and maths.

Extra-curricular activities such as these introduce children to new skills, engage them in social activities, develop positive learning traits and help to shape their lives in a positive way. Every child has talents and skills, some of these are more difficult to find and recognise, it is our job to unearth and cherish these latent abilities.

The school organises a ski trip that is open to children in Year 5 and 6 and at the end of Year 6 the class go on a residential outdoor pursuits trip.





The range of extra-curricular activites is wide and varied. Rich, relevant and stimulating for all pupils across almost all subject areas and is complemented by a varied choice and numerous enriching activities and visits.
